Afternoon around 1400 Hrs, our car will pick you up from Hotel & then proceed for half day sightseeing tour of Delhi.


**Delhi** is a city that bridges two different worlds. Old Delhi, once the capital of Islamic India, is a labyrinth of narrow lanes lined with crumbling havelis and formidable mosques. In contrast, the new capital, designed by Sir Edward Lutyens is composed of spacious, tree-lined avenues and imposing government buildings. Delhi has been the seat of power of a number of dynasties – the Rajputs, the Afghans, the Turks and the Mughals who continued their imperial line until the British.

**Visit Place:- India Gate, Khan Market, Parliament house, Purana Qila etc.**

Visit Presidential Palace i.e. **Rashtrapati Bhavan** and the secretariat buildings - the centre of all government activity and down the main avenue, on the impressive Rajpath to the World War I memorial arch, the India Gate.

**India Gate**, a 42 m-high archway stands tall at the centre of New Delhi. It commemorates the 70,000 Indian soldiers who lost their lives fighting for the British Army during the World War I. Another memorial, **Amar Jawan Jyoti** was added much later, after India got its independence. The eternal flame burns day and night under the arch to remind the nation of soldiers who laid down their lives in the Indo-Pakistan War of December 1971.

Later, drive to visit Purana Qila, Purana Quila standing stoically amidst wild greenery. Built on the site of the most ancient of the numerous cities of Delhi, Indraprastha, **Purana Quila** is roughly rectangular in shape having a circuit of nearly two kilometers.



The thick ramparts crowned by merlons have three gateways provided with bastions on either side. It was surrounded by a wide moat, connected to river Yamuna, which used to flow on the east of the fort. The northern gateway, called the Talaqui darwaza or the forbidden gateway, combines the typically Islamic pointed arch with Hindu Chhatris and brackets; whereas the southern gateway called the Humayun Darwaza also had a similar plan.

After Visit Purana Qila, Drive to visit Khan Market-This market remains a favorite among expats and Delhi's upper classes. The popular shopping destination features many up-market stores, selling everything from latest in fashions and books, to

home wares and groceries. Take a break at one of the many restaurants and cafes as you rationalize the purchase of a luxurious item.
